Revolution/Declaration of Independence

The events that followed the French and Indian War laid the foundation for Revolution and the Declaration of Independence. Anger towards the British taxation policy and increasing control over the colonies led to many events like the Stamp Act Congress, Boston Tea Party, and Boston Massacre. These events coupled with influential writings like Thomas Paine's *Common Sense*, added to the fervor for independence. From the first shots fired at Lexington and Concord in April 1775, to the Declaration of Independence in July of 1776, the American colonies began a trek towards independence that it seemed unlikely they would win. But with amazing resolve and international assistance, the colonies pulled off the impossible at Yorktown. The thirteen British colonies were now free.
